TICAGRELOR tablets (Brilique®) - GP Support Resource

GPs may wish to use the following to assist with the review of those patients requiring extended (60 mg twice daily) therapy.

If there are any concerns or queries, please contact the Cardiologist at the relevant hospital for advice.

Consider:	Checked
That the patient has remained on ticagrelor 90mg BD for the previous 12 months and tolerated	
That the patient is compliant and is taking ticagrelor as prescribed	
That the patient is on concurrent aspirin 75mg daily (must be used in conjunction with aspirin 75mg daily)	
That the patient does not have any new condition which increases the risk of bleeding	
That the patient has not had any signs of active bleeding or drop in Haemoglobin	
That the patient has not had any new medications which increase the risk of bleeding. If so, consider stopping e.g. NSAID	
If anticoagulation is required- speak to cardiologist for review of antiplatelets. Ticagrelor should not usually be used in conjunction with an oral anticoagulant	
That the patient has not had any new medication that is contraindicated with ticagrelor e.g. clarithromycin, ketoconazole (see SPC)	
That the patient is receiving gastro protection (normally a PPI)
