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DEXAMETHASONE injection – different injection strengths

The Pan Mersey Area Prescribing Committee recommends that dexamethasone injection should be prescribed as dexamethasone or dexamethasone (base) and <u>not</u> as dexamethasone phosphate or dexamethasone sodium phosphate

SAFETY

Staff prescribing, dispensing, and administering dexamethasone injection should be aware of the following:

- > There are a number of different presentations of dexamethasone injection now available. These differ in strength, which may create the potential for a patient to receive an incorrect dose. In addition to this, accompanying product information may also cause some misunderstanding.
- Prescribers: to avoid confusion dexamethasone injection should be prescribed as dexamethasone or dexamethasone (base) and <u>not</u> as dexamethasone phosphate or dexamethasone sodium phosphate
- > Staff administering dexamethasone injection:
 - if the injection is not prescribed as above contact the prescriber (or pharmacist in a hospital setting) for clarification and amendment of the instructions to administer
 - if staff administering dexamethasone are unsure of the injection volume to be administered please confirm this with the prescriber (or pharmacist in a hospital setting) prior to administration
- > **Pharmacists**: please ensure when dispensing that the clinical check includes a check of the strength and dosage in terms of dexamethasone base
- > The information overleaf gives examples of the labelling of six brands of dexamethasone 1ml injection available at the time of writing. Note: There are also other sizes of vials or ampoules. e.g., 2 ml.
- > Always ensure that you consult the most up to date product information for details of the various dexamethasone injections available
